	tend to be less prepared for the legal challenges their careers might present. Moving from a technical
	expert to a managerial role not only advances a career but also introduces potential legal liabilities.
	This course is designed to shed light on the legal aspects of managerial and engineering roles. Students
	will learn about the legal responsibilities and risks of running engineering-focused businesses. By the
	end of the course, participants will have a solid understanding of how to manage the legal aspects of
	their professional activities, ensuring a safer and more informed career path.
